Abstract – This is a collection of 612 stereoview cards, which are

dual photographic images mounted on paper cards that produce a 3-D effect when viewed using a handheld stereoscope. Images in this collection reflect Philippine life and customs, the 1898 Battle of Manila Bay during the Spanish-American War, the 1899-1902 Philippine-American War (also known to Americans as the Philippine Insurrection), churches, bridges, architecture, native peoples, and U.S. administration

of the Philippine Islands. Of the hundreds of stereoview card publishers, only a relative few

produced series on the Philippines. American interest in the Philippines was high around 1900 when the islands were a new, strange, exotic, and dangerous territorial acquisition. While this collection is by no means exhaustive, it contains a good representation of the Philippine-related output of major publishers.

Biographical Name – Rafael O. Ortigas, Jr.

Biographical Note – Rafael O. Ortigas, Jr. was a prominent businessman,

attorney, and bibliophile in Metro Manila,

Philippines. He was also president of Ortigas &

Company, L.P. and of the Ortigas Foundation.

He was born in Manila on May 19, 1937. His

grandfather was Don Francisco Ortigas, Sr., who with a partner had purchased the large estate Hacienda de Mandoloyon from the Augustinian Order in 1920.

This estate was to become the modern Ortigas Center. Rafael's father, Francisco Ortigas, Jr., a prominent real

estate developer, was primarily responsible for

transforming the Hacienda into the vibrant and thriving commercial and residential community that

Ortigas Center is today.

Rafael was educated at the Ateneo de Manila, completing elementary school in 1949 and graduating from the School of Law in 1960. He was admitted to the Philippine Bar on January 31, 1961. His brother is Ignacio R. O. Ortigas, married to Margarita Melian. His sister is Maria Rosario Ortigas "Chari", married to Alberto Montilla. Rafael married Begoña Barrenechea, and they had three children: Ma. Teresa, Ma.

Asuncion, and Rafael Andoni.

In 1996, Rafael established the Ortigas Foundation, Inc., whose primary purpose is to "promote pride in being Filipino by supporting the study of Philippine history, culture and arts." Rafael was one of the most knowledgeable bibliophiles in the Philippines, and he collected over 7,000 volumes relating to Spain and the Philippines. This collection became the cornerstone of the Ortigas Foundation Library and has been supplemented by additional acquisitions over the years.

Scope and Contents – This collection consists of various groupings of card stereoviews, variously known as stereographs or stereoscopes. These are dual photographic images mounted on paper cards, to be viewed with a hand-held stereoscope. The images are photographed by a special camera from slightly different viewpoints, approximating the difference between human eyes, and provided the appearance of a three-dimensional image when viewed through the lenses of the device.

Stereographs were an especially popular Victorian parlor entertainment. The first card stereographs were introduced in the 1850's and were used primarily for educational purposes, emphasizing geography and history. By the turn of the century, stereoviews reflected a wider range of perspectives, although this particular collection is solidly historical and cultural.

This collection contains stereoviews having the Philippines as the subject matter. With the victory over Spanish colonialists in the Battle of Manila Bay and the subsequent Treaty of Paris ending the Spanish-American War, the United States assumed, rather reluctantly, dominion over the Philippine Islands. War propaganda dominates the early stereoviews from 1898-1902, including battle scene from Luzon skirmishes, followed by geographical and cultural views that emphasized the differences between supposedly advanced American society and the presumed primitive conditions in the Philippines. This collection has been arranged into 12 series, following Mr. Ortigas' original order.

Series 1: Underwood & Underwood, 1898-1901, 1904, and undated. Series consists of 248 cards, arranged numerically by catalog number assigned by Perez (2002).

Series 2: Keystone View Company, 1898, 1899, 1905, 1906, and undated. Series contains 134 cards, arranged numerically by negative number.

Series 4: C. H. Graves, 1900, 1902. Series contains 18 cards, arranged numerically by catalog number.

Notes -

1) Coding notes: Card codes (i.e., "U5A") follow the naming conventions established by Perez (2002) and identify the publisher, image or negative number, variant image, and variant captions; they are used

similar to library call numbers. Captions are reproduced exactly as they appear on the cards, including punctuation, capitalization, mistakes and typographical errors. As nearly all captions end in "Philippines", "Philippine Islands", or "P.I." those appellations have been deleted to reduce redundancy. Item numbers begin with "SV" (i.e., "SV-0001") and are used as Ortigas Foundation accession numbers.

- 2) Publishers note: "Underwood" and code letter "U" refer to Underwood & Underwood. "Keystone" and code letter "K" refer to Keystone View Company. "White" and code letter "W" refer to H. C. White Company. "Graves" and code letter "G" refer to C. H. Graves. "Liberty" and code letter "L" refer to Liberty Brand Stereo Views. "American" and code letter "A" refer to American Stereoscopic Company. "Anonymous" and code letters "AN" refer to flatprinted (i.e., half-tone printed images) cards with no identifying publisher, photographer, or series. "Griffith" and code letter "F" refer to Griffith & Griffith (except for flat-printed cards, which are designated "GG" to conform to Perez). "Kilburn" and code letter "B" refer to B. W. Kilburn. Code letters "REL" refer to a series of anonymous religiousthemed cards (possibly by Underwood, as the choice of translated languages is the same).
- 3) Dates note: Stereoview cards typically show only the date the image was taken (or copyrighted) and not the date the card was produced, so the copyright date is used here.
- 4) Items described in red text are missing or checked out and not in binders (October 2014).
