## **Biographical Note**

Col. Narciso L. Manzano was a former Philippine Scout officer who served for many years with the 14 Engineers. He was the highest ranking Filipino serving in the US Army under MacArthur's Command. Besides his duties with the 14 Engineers before and during the war, he was also the head of intelligence for the Central Luzon area during the war.

## **Scope and Contents:**

The collection consists of printed historical, cultural and administrative materials collected about the military administration and his personal life before, during and after the Second World War in the Philippines. These printed materials are reproductions from the digital assets continuously being acquired through the heirs of Col. Manzano and the Philippine Veterans Affairs Office from the National Archives in Maryland, USA.
